1a Update on Engagement Portfolio

Working in partnership with the Council 'Get Going Project'.	This is a 12 week programme which introduces referrals into physical activity. The patient has plenty of support from a Get Going Motivator who works with the patient to achieve their short and long term goals.
TARGET Event (alternatives to admissions)	Our in house strategic event was attended by over 70 GPs. The event focussed on some alternatives to admissions and showcased two new services. Round table group work to look at strengths, weaknesses and desired improvements for current services.
Clinical Reference Groups (CRGs)	Our CRGs are an educational forum for our GPs to showcase good practice and/or learn from each other.
Quarterly Mental Health Forums	This forum supports the monitoring of IAPT. It is also an opportunity for our GPs and Providers to bring issues to the table and find solutions together.
November GP Forum	Excellent turnout ensuring our Practices had an opportunity to participate in the Primary Care Co-Commissioning remit and the various options available, prior to voting in January.
Adult Safeguarding Training and Introduction to two new Urgent Care Children's pathways	Workshop coordinated for February for our Practice Adult Safeguarding Leads. Also to showcase the two new Urgent Care Children's pathways (Asthma and Gastro)

2 Increasing Primary Care Capacity

All practices have submitted their December data. Initial findings show that additional capacity has generated approximately 4500 extra appointments across our Locality. Patients are able to access Primary medical care via a variety of health care professionals, GPs, Locums, Nurses, Health Care Assistants. Or alternatively have the opportunity to access GPs via telephone consultations.

Practices have commented on how these additional appointments are helping to improve the care of their patients.
